- ❖ Present the biochemical structure and nature of volatile aromatic compounds.
- *What is the difference between aromatherapy and phytotherapy? How does the specific nature of aromatic molecules endow essential oils with a unique therapeutical potential?*

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- ❖ Classify natural volatile aromatic compounds according to their hydro carbonated structure and their attached functions
 - *How to recognize an essential oil with its carbonate structure and the presence or a functional structure? Each essential oil has a specific structure, this structure acts upon various pathological conditions.*
 - *Learn how each molecular structure has a correspondent with infection, inflammation, spasms, nervous system, immune function and mucus conditions to offer an adequate treatment to your client.*

- ❖ Apply the pharmacological approach of the correlation chemical structure/ physiological & pharmacological activity.
 - *How to treat, relieve or accompany symptoms to elaborate a specific treatment?*
 - *The therapist will learn how to structure into the “reverse pyramid”: first choose the adequate molecular family, the molecule and the essential oil.*
 - *Example on how to offer a protocol for: infections, inflammation, spasms, immune system and mucus conditions.*

- ❖ Identify the importance of this ternary in essential oils : Matter / Energy / Information
 - *An essential oil is multi-potential and can be used through the skin, digestive, respiratory and olfactory pathways.*
 - *As it is endowed with not one molecule (as in synthetic drugs) it can be used in various galenic forms (capsules, suppositories, creams etc...)*

- ❖ Examine the ternary of external interfaces in connection with the aromatic ternary ecto-endodermic interfaces.

How each interface (skin, oral, olfactory) has a priority connection with the matter aspect, or the energy aspect or the informational aspect of essential oils?

- ❖ Demonstrate their importance and their significance in the perspective of life enhancing processes.
 - *Why, in essence, EO are meant to be used on a long term basis? Using Eos on a short term basis is the key to fail a protocol.*
 - *Why should allopathic medicine be used on a short term basis as opposed to EOS? Dr PENOE’s concept of “life enhancing process”.*

- ❖ Explain the main and general safety measures with the use of essential oils in aromatic medicine.

- ❖ Identify the Dynamic Interfacial Physiology and Physiopathology.
 - *A human body is complex and various organs are connected to one another.*
 - *How are they connected? How do they harm one another and how to use this knowledge to answer the question: “how do the skin, the lungs, the digestive interface can be used in conjunction to help one another?”*

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- ❖ Relate the specificity of aromatic volatile molecular families in connection with the ternary of the external ecto-endodermic interfaces.
 - Each aromatic molecular family is dedicated to a specific interface: skin, olfactory, respiratory and digestive.
 - Learn to classify the molecules according to the target interface.

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- ❖ Relate the connection of aromatic molecular families with the two endodermic* interfaces (*oral and respiratory pathways)
 - Which molecule can or can't be inhaled? Which molecule can or can't be absorbed?

- ❖ Analyze the interaction of aromatic volatile molecular families with the successive parts of the endodermic digestive interface.
 - How do aromatic molecules travel through the oral pathway?
 - How does the hepatic metabolism interact?
 - Which pathways should be used to avoid molecules being metabolized by the liver (example for respiratory conditions).

- ❖ Recognize the concept of the Primary Interface* for health maintenance and health restoration. (*Primary interface = digestive (oral and rectal pathway).)
 - How the use of the oral pathway enable to turn pathogenic flora (bad bacteria) into a symbiotic flora (healthy bacteria)

- ❖ Illustrate the crucial role of the intestinal flora in the conception of psycho-immunology: the "second brain" of human being.
 - When faced with a emotional, psycholoigal unrest, it is usually taught that "it is all in the brain".
 - Dr Pénoël will point out how the digestive pathway (our second brain) can directly act upon brain receptors to bring relief.

- ❖ Explain the absorption and transformation of main volatile aromatic molecules.
 - Essential oils are made out of molecules. Once into the human body how does the liver transform those molecules to make them hydrosoluble so that they are eliminated through the kidneys?
 - Has the human body the enzymatic equipment to metabolize those natural molecules? What about synthetic molecules? Do aromatic molecules accumulate in the body?

- ❖ Choose the appropriate galenic preparations for the best results in using the endodermic digestive interface.
 - Learn how to make your own capsules for optimum action.



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- ❖ Apply this knowledge for the treatment of local pathological conditions of the endodermic digestive interface itself.
 - *In case of an intestinal infection: how to target the intestinal pathway?*
 - *Which molecular family, molecule and essential oil should be used?*

- ❖ Exemplify applications for obtaining systemic effect through the use of the endodermic digestive interface.
 - *How can the intestinal pathway be used to target a respiratory or nervous problem?*
 - *Which molecular family, molecule and essential oil should be used?*

- ❖ List the importance of the three "terrains" (breeding ground): bioelectronic, micro biotic and psycho-immune.
 - *How to use Eos to transform the pH of the flora (to prevent bacterial proliferation)?*
 - *How to rebalance the intestinal flora (symbiotic, pathogenic)?*
 - *How are essential oils classified according to a specific psychological profile?*

- ❖ Explain the interactions between bacteria and volatile aromatic molecules.
 - *How do aromatic molecules have the ability to eradicate pathogenic bacteria while respecting the symbiotic ones: what mechanisms are involved?*

- ❖ Identify the fundamental differences with the interaction between bacteria and antibiotics.
 - *While antibiotics create phenomenon of bacterial mutation or resistance. Such mechanisms are not observed with essential oils.*
 - *What mechanisms are involved, what are the clinical results when individuals use Eos on a long term basis?*

- ❖ Illustrate applications for conditions that require a massive and intensive absorption of volatile aromatic molecules: techniques of enhanced accelerated penetration.
 - *Which essential oils to use for respiratory infections. Practical demonstration will be shown.*
